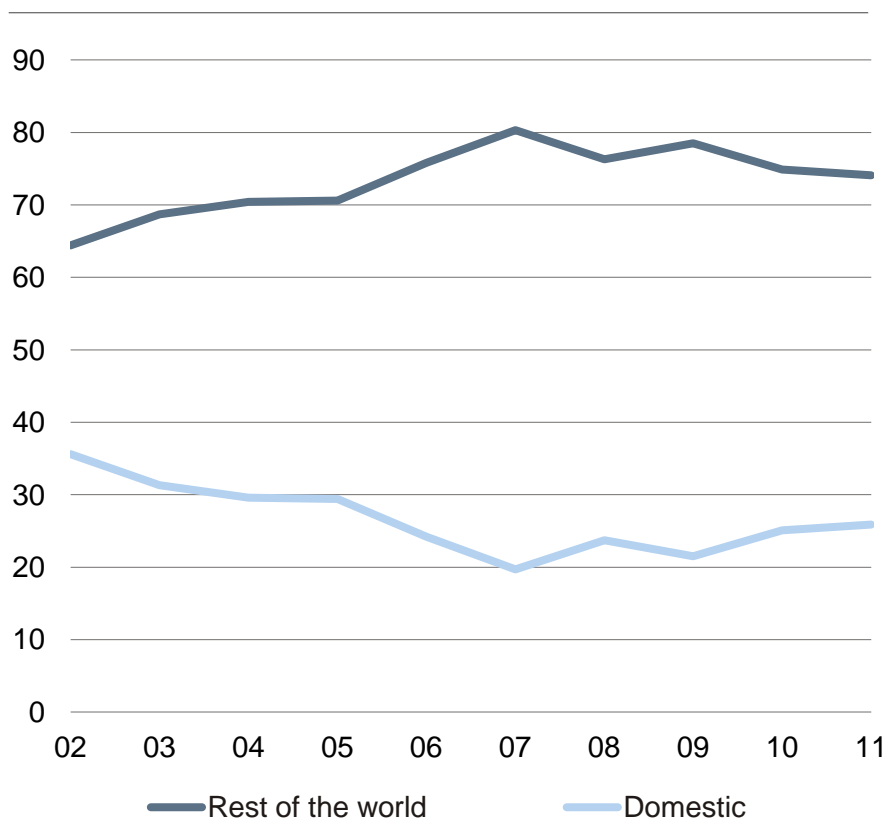

Where public debt is held – percentage of total

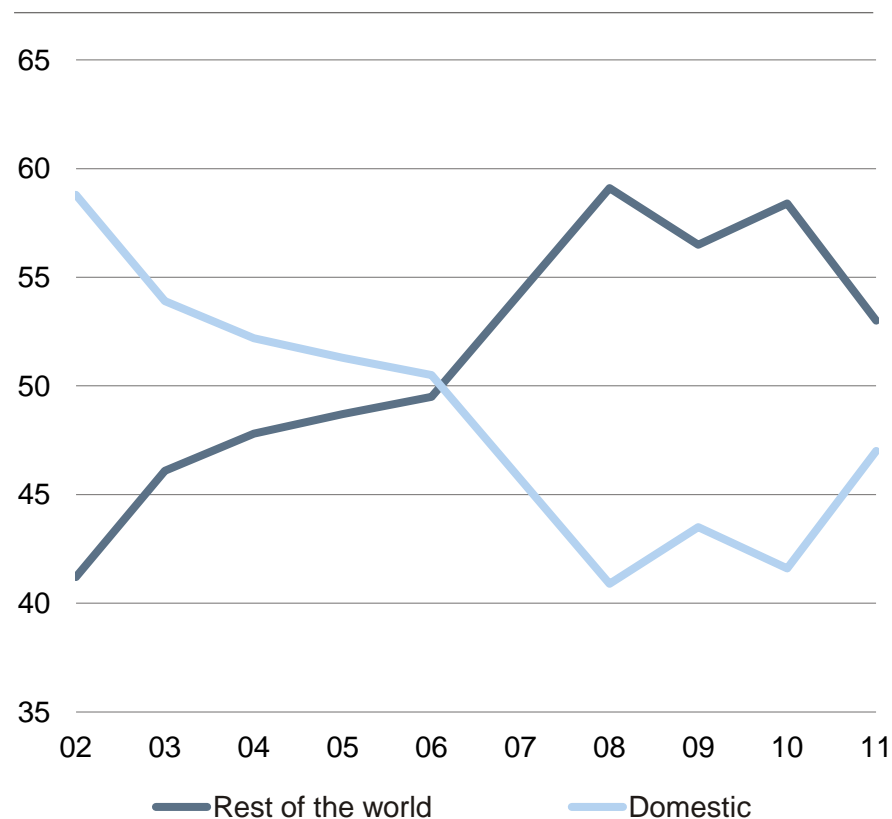

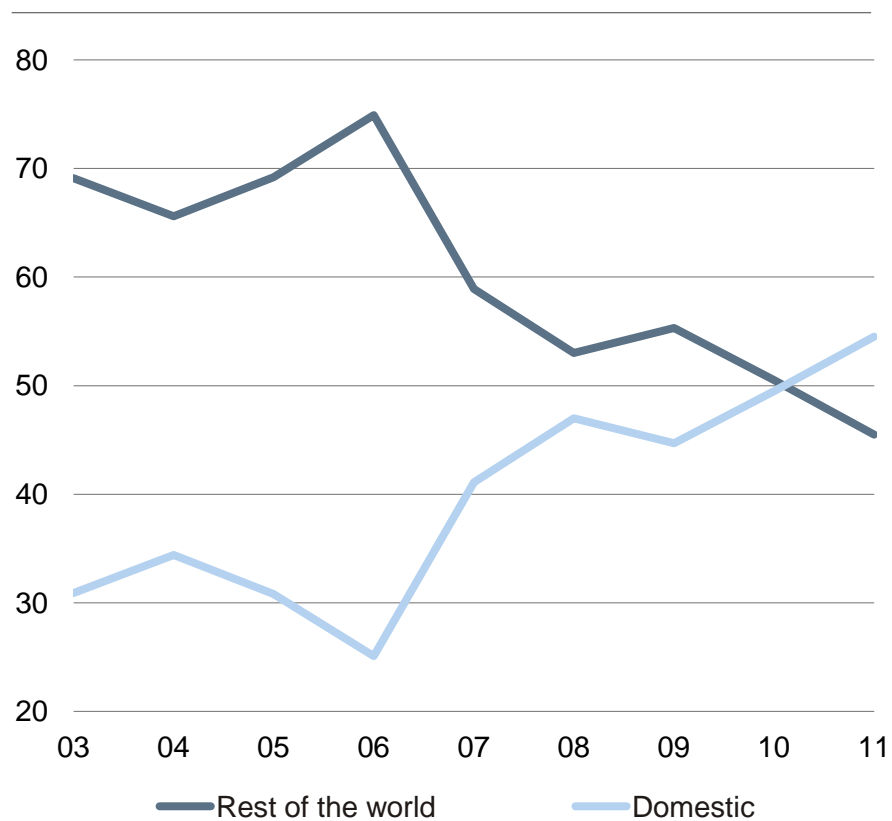

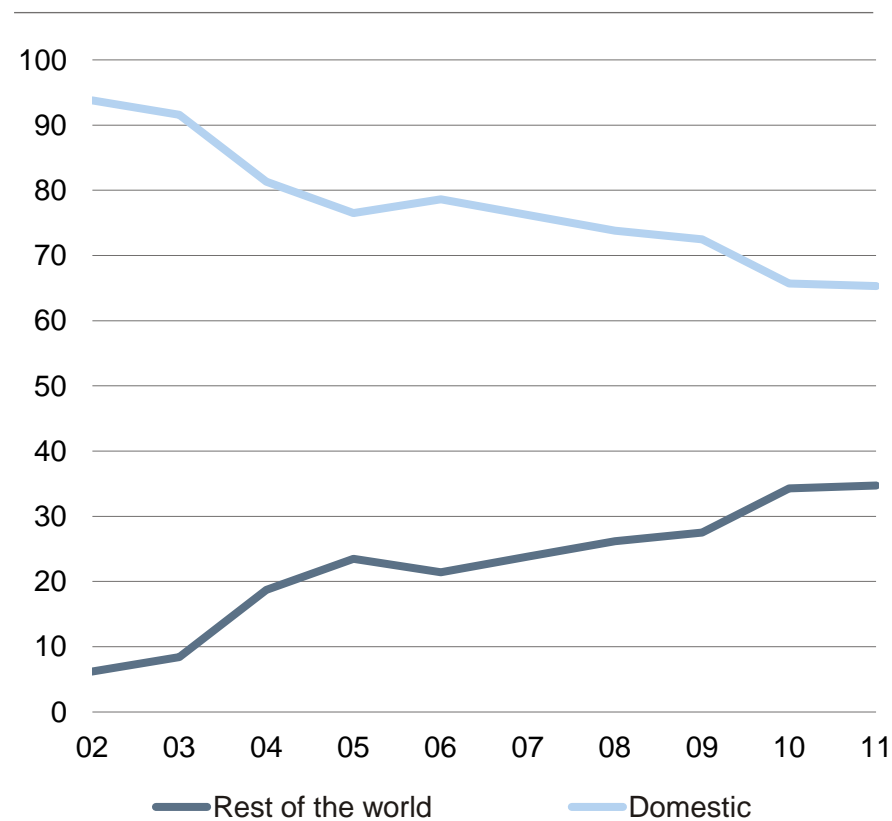

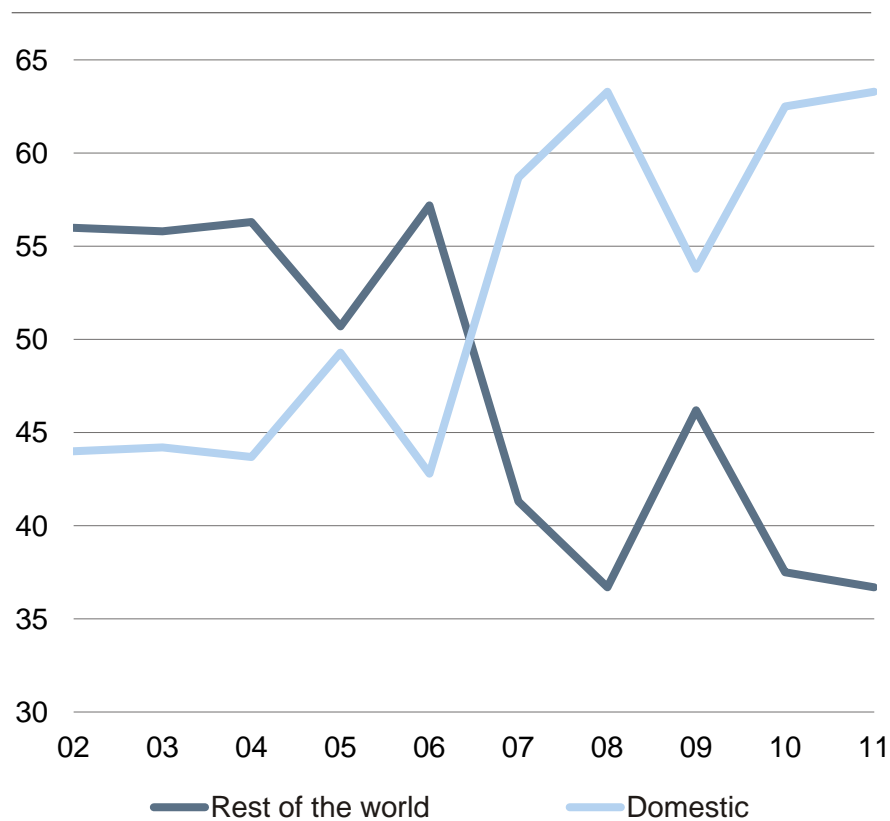

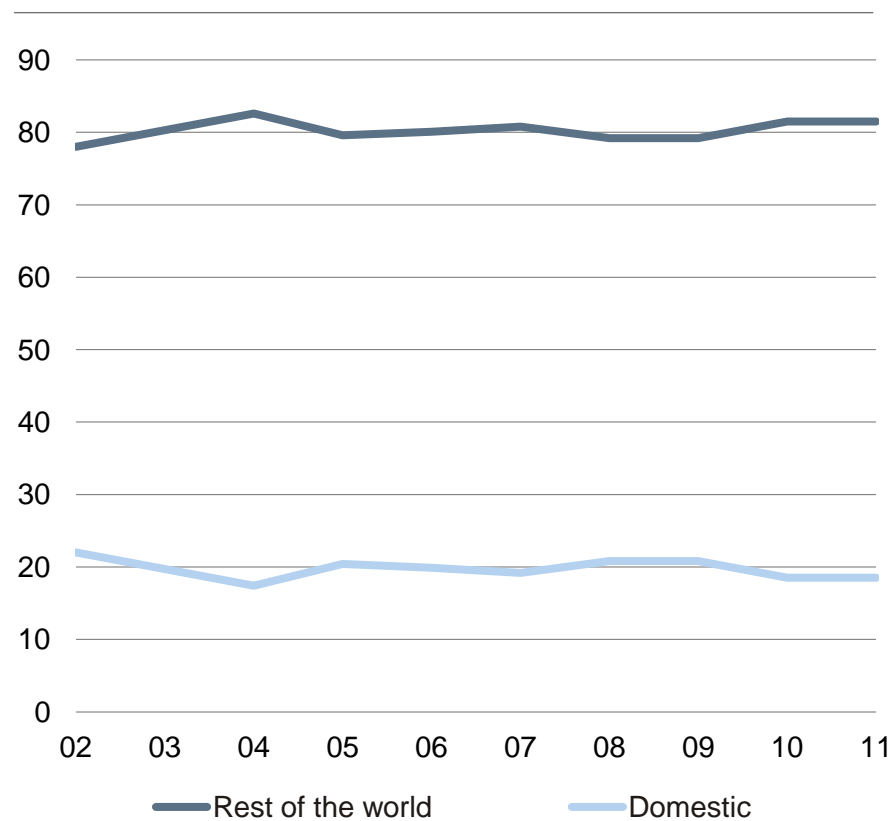

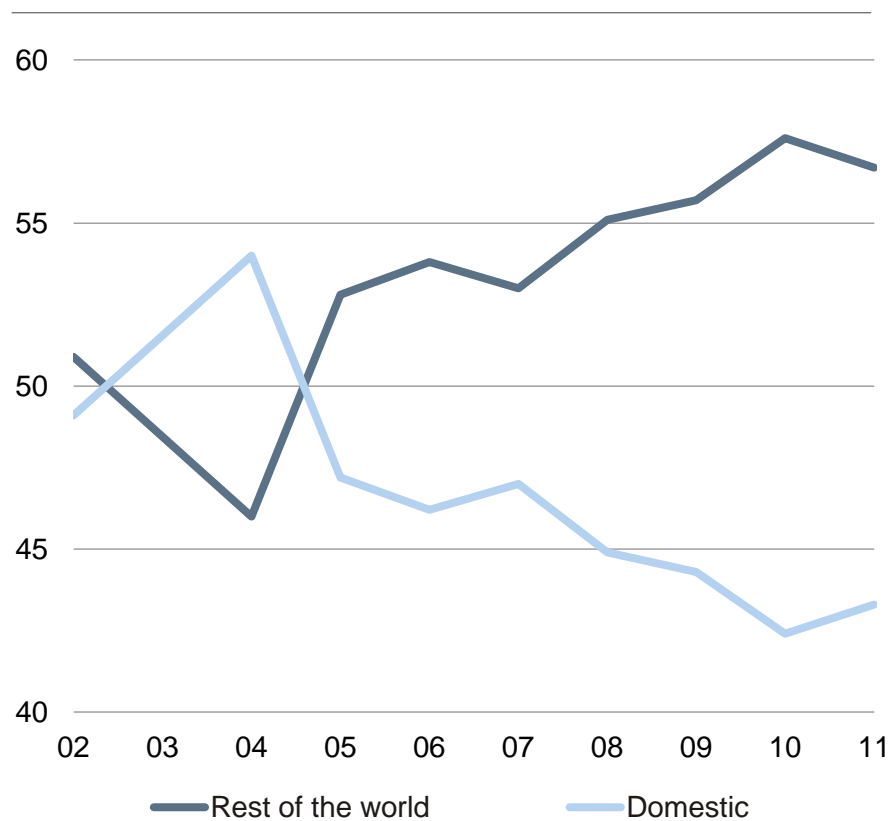

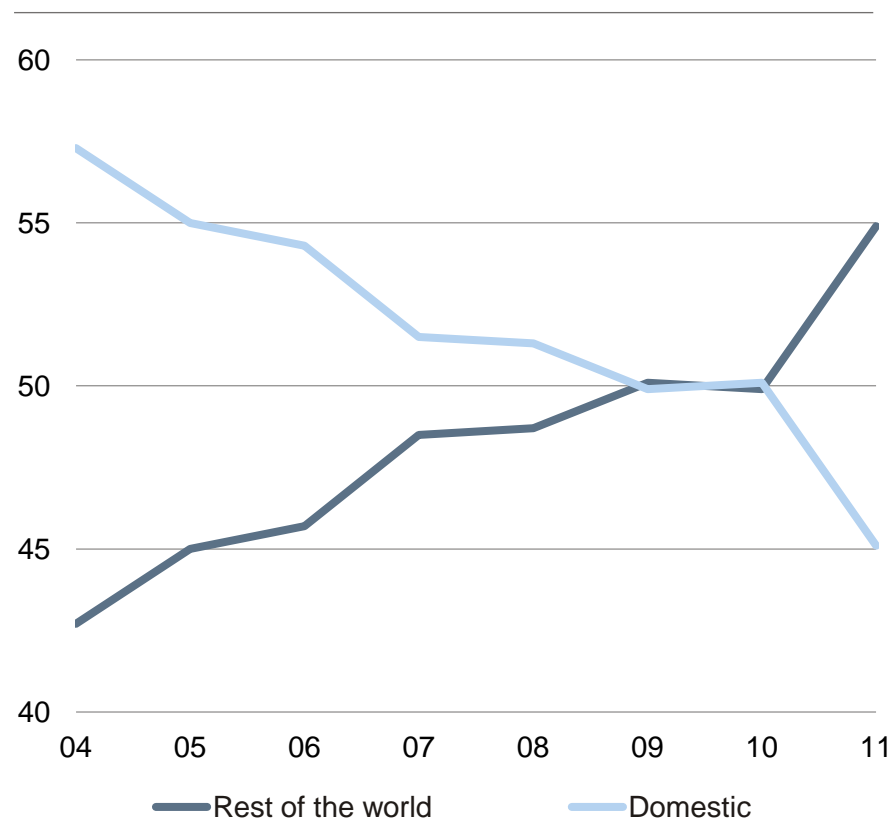

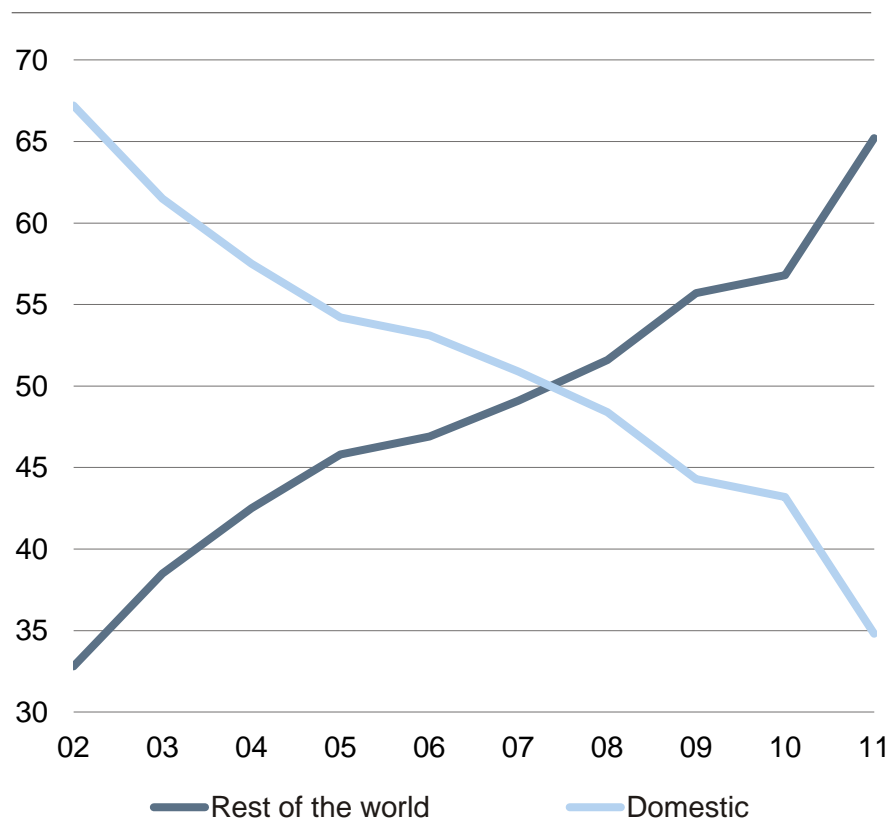

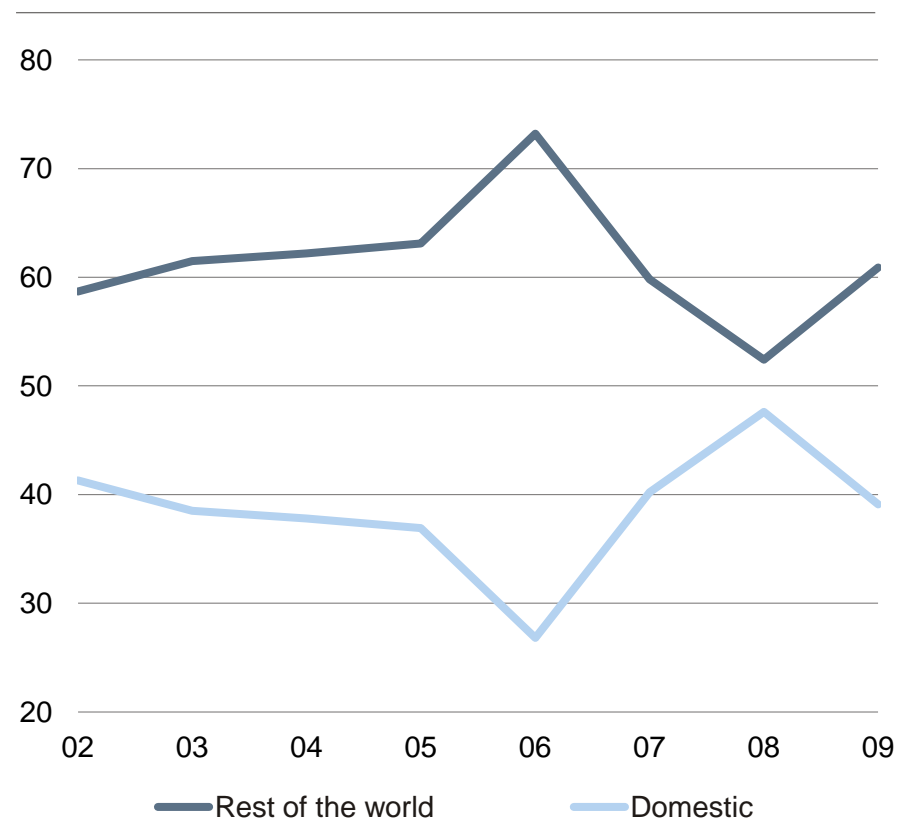

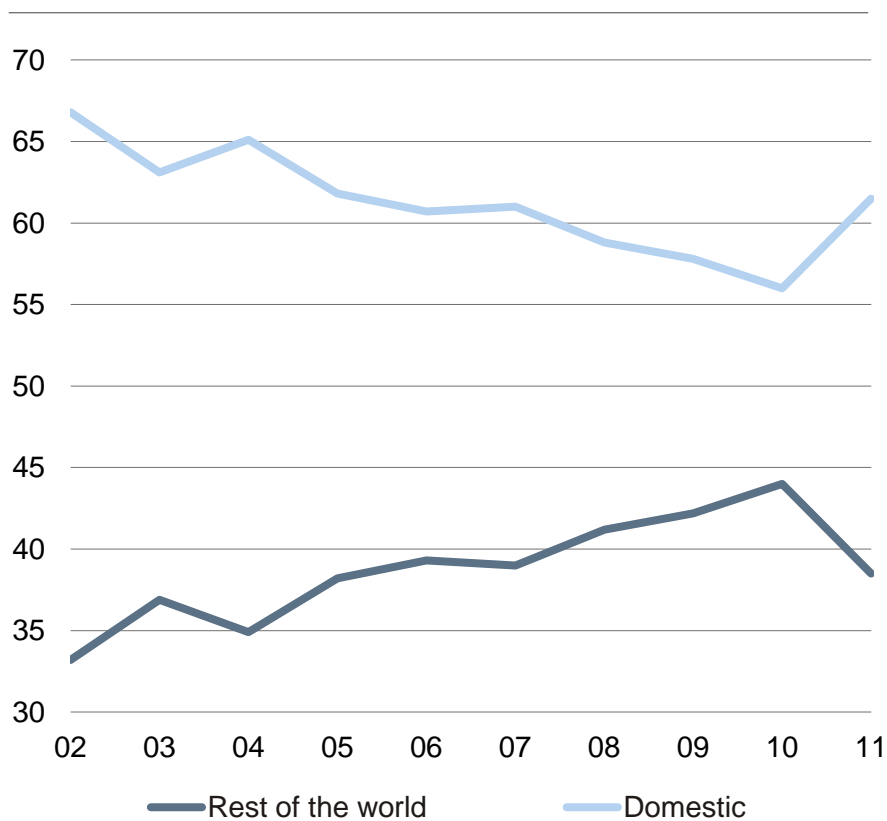

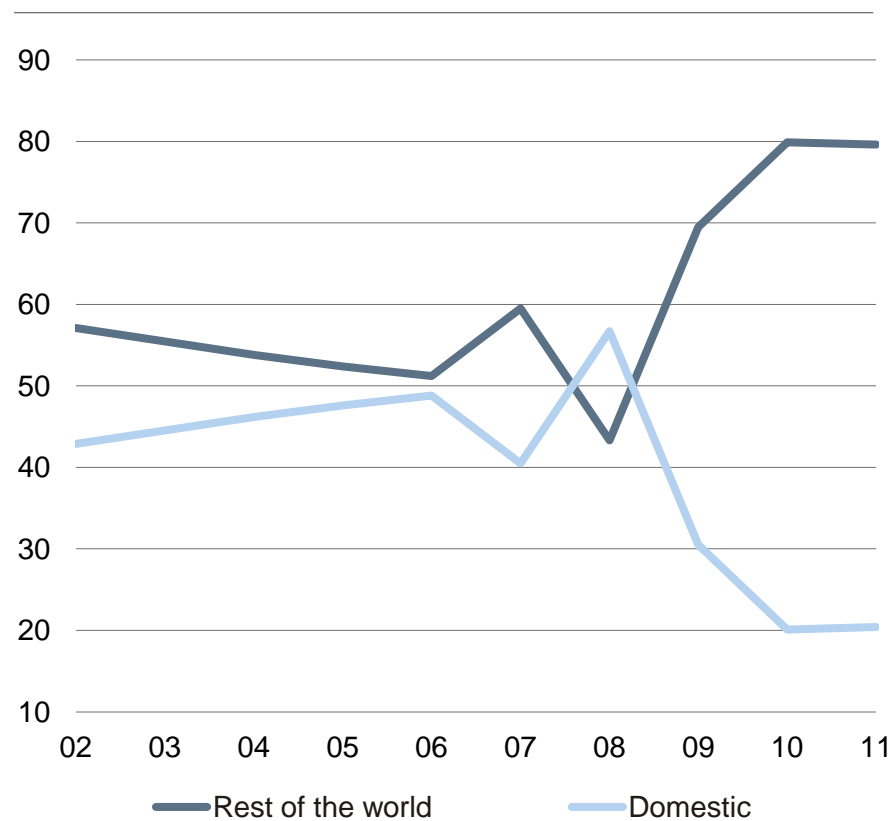

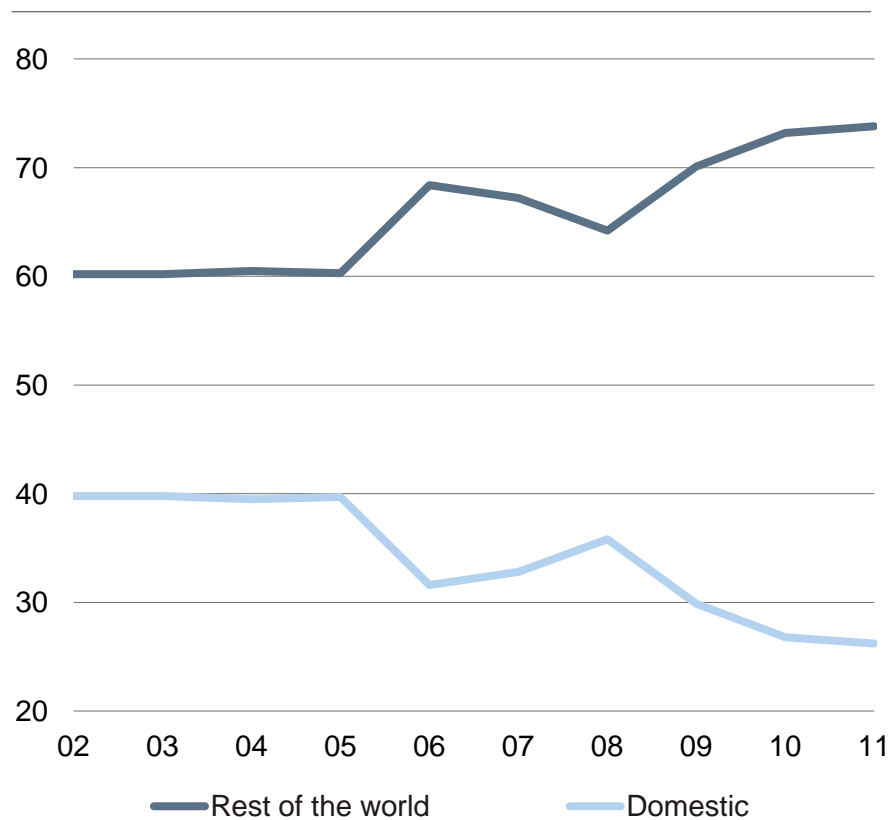

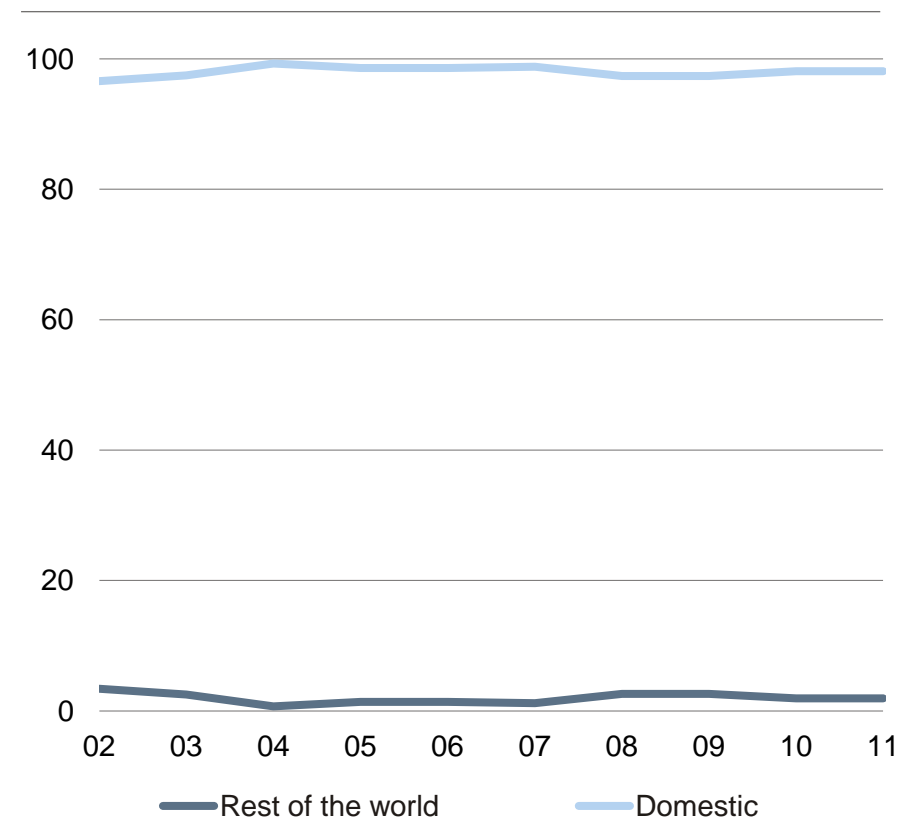

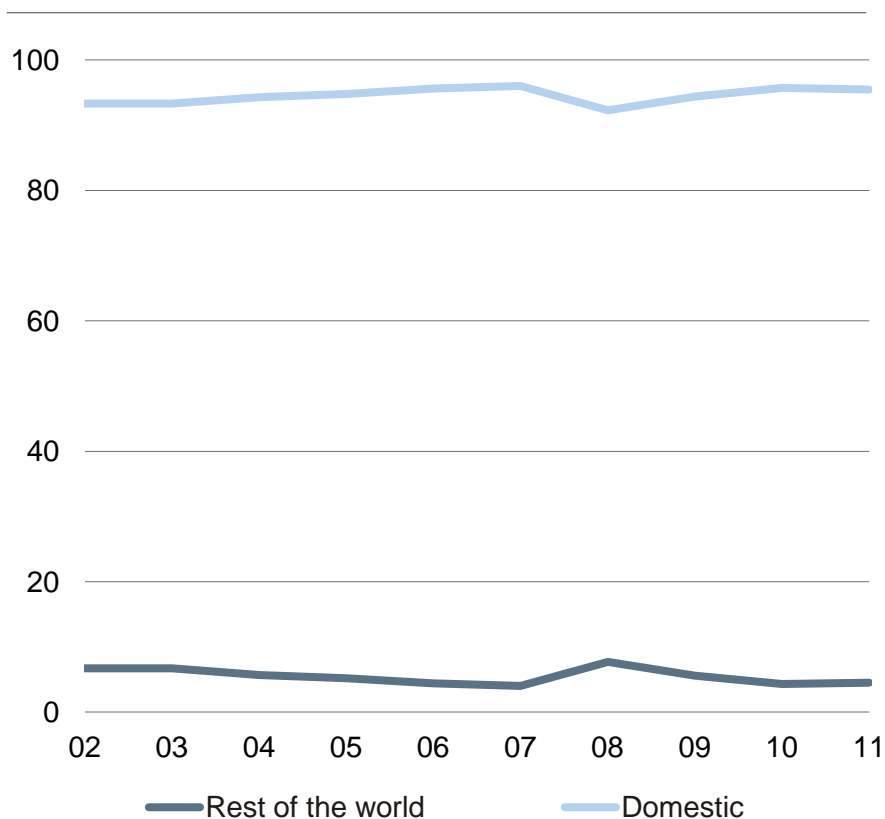

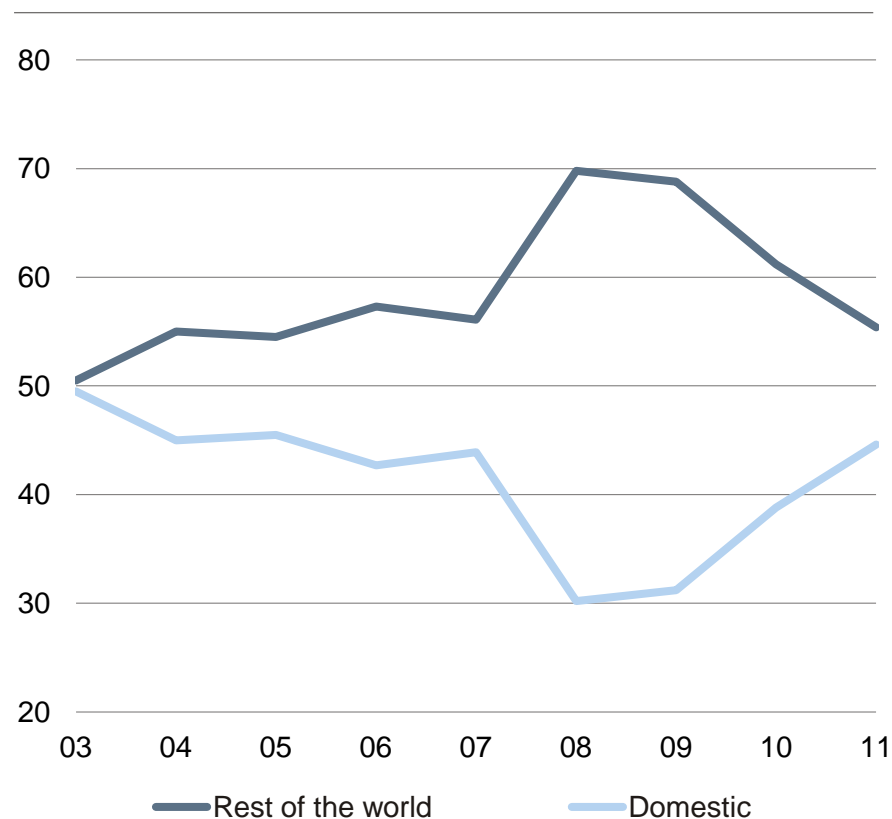

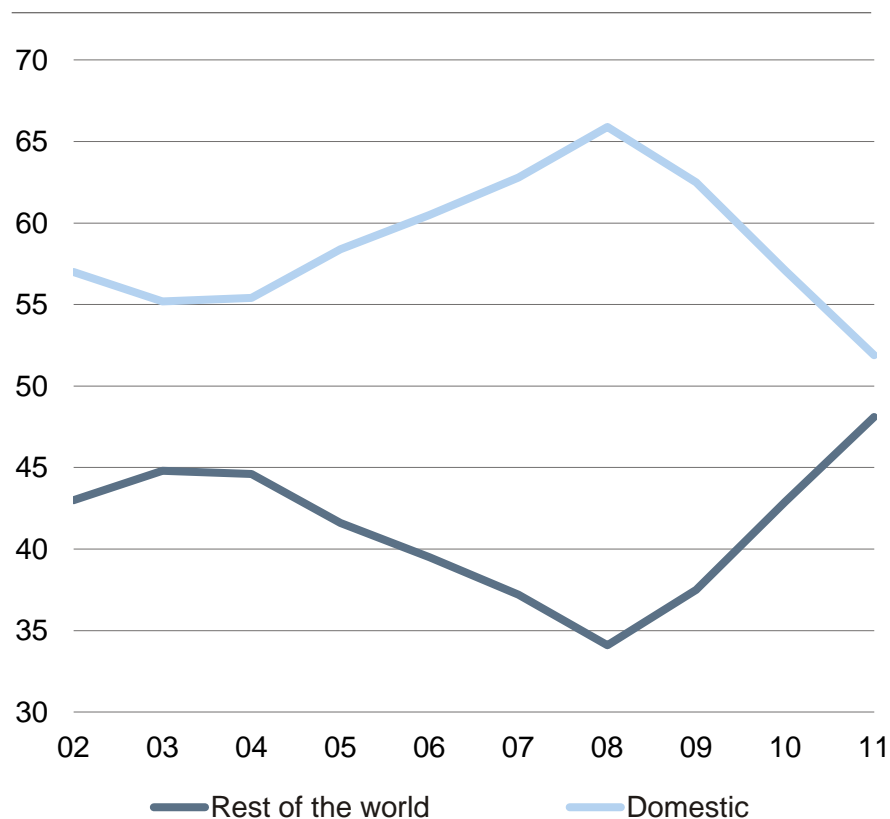

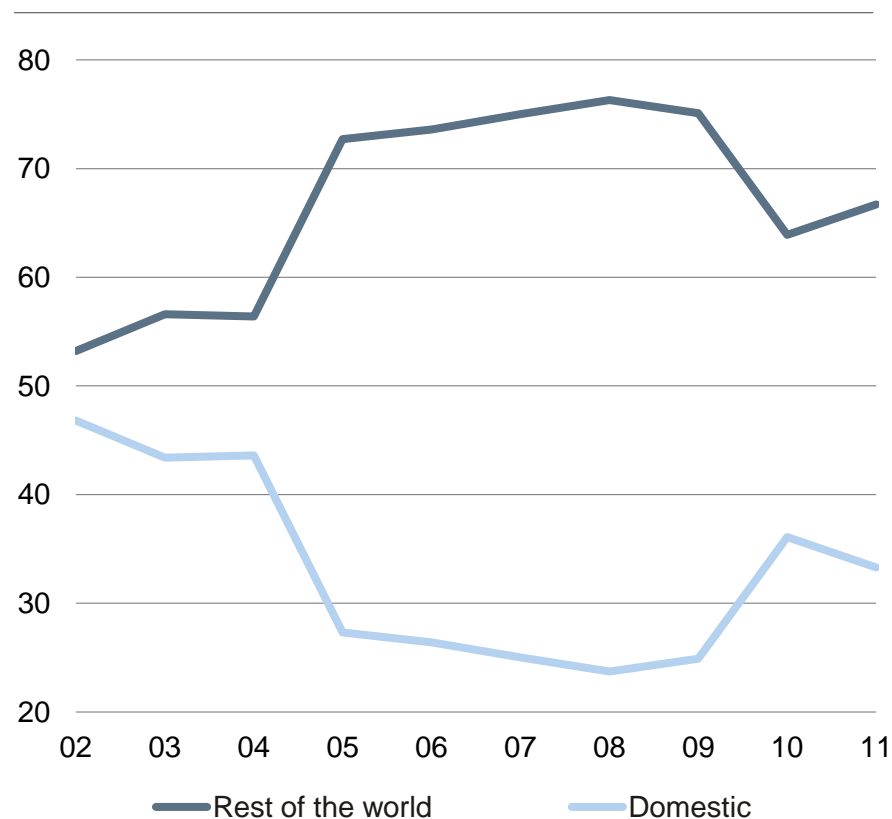

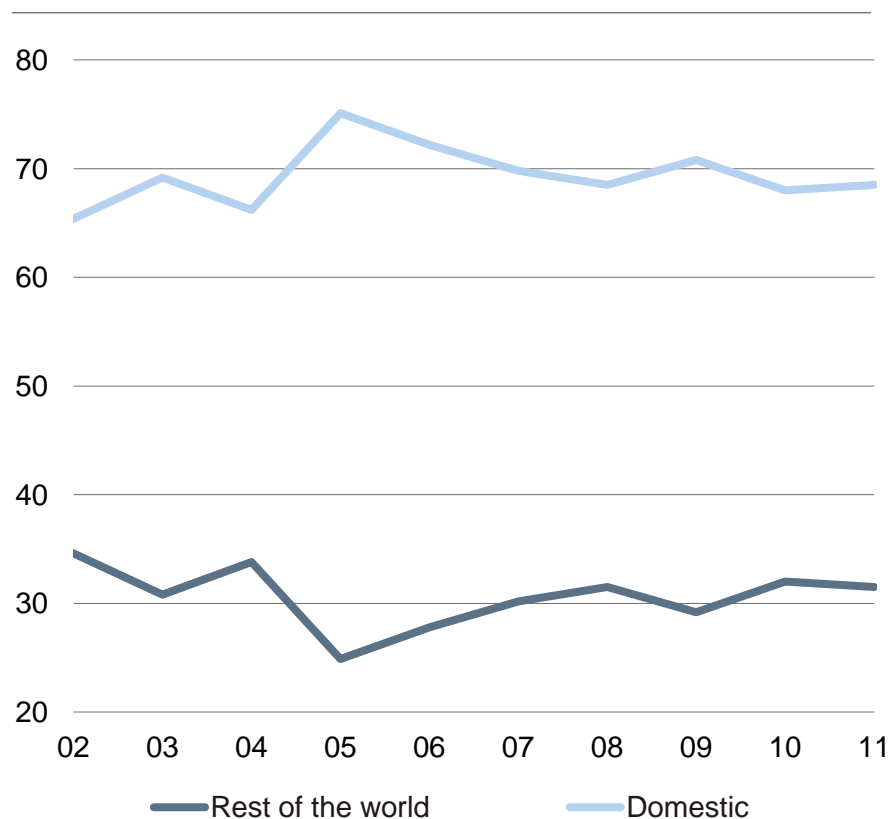

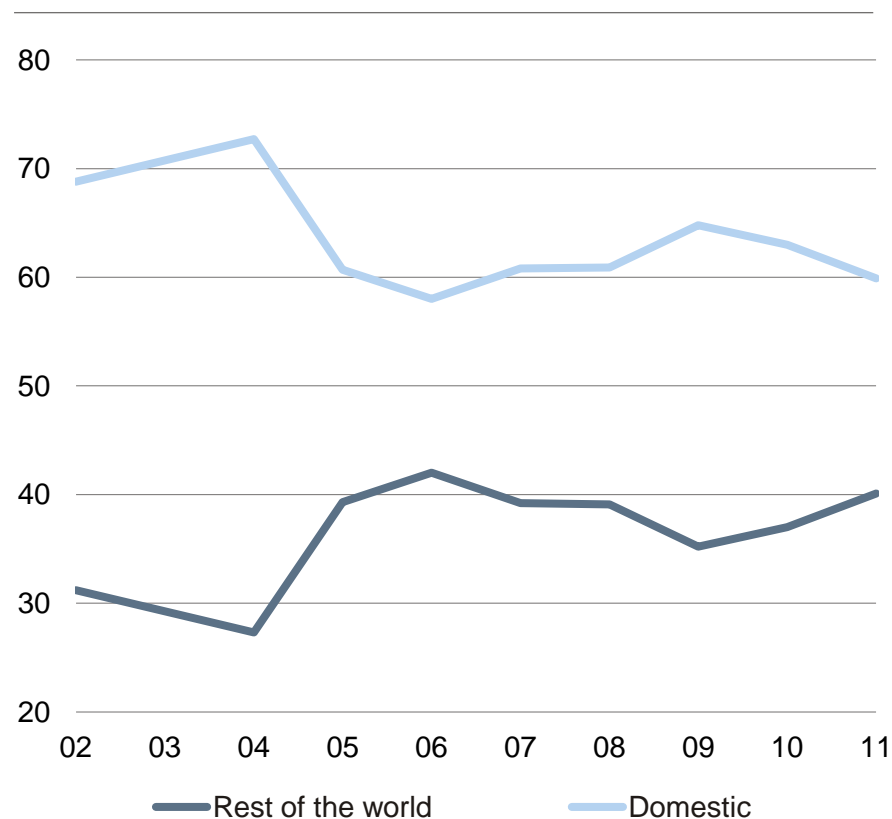

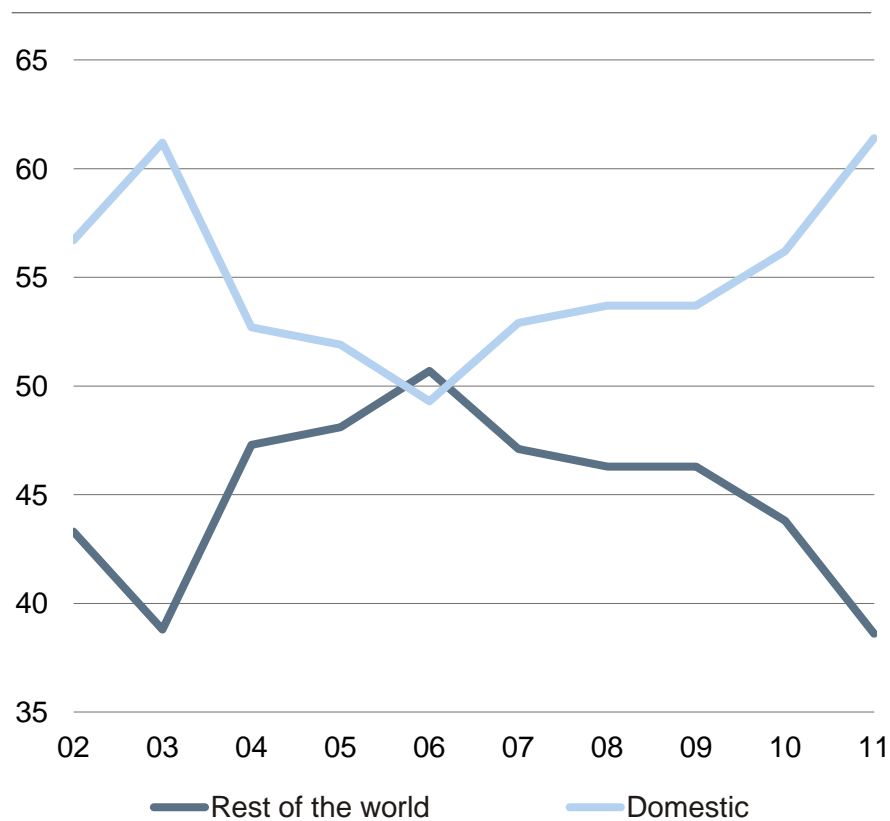

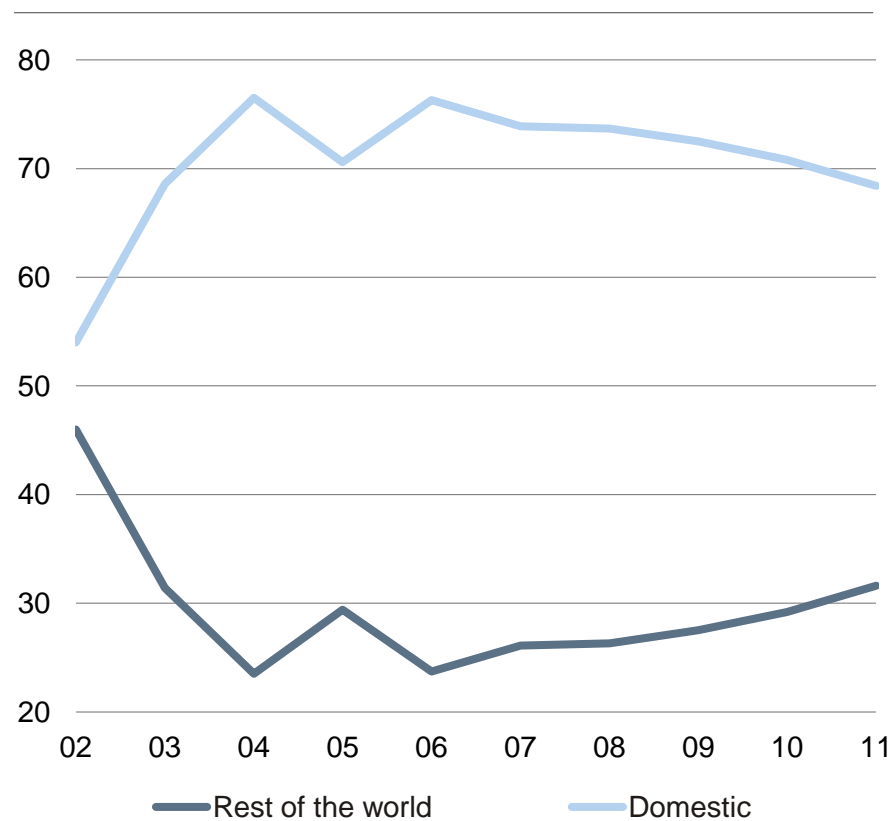
